CALL FOR ARTICLES

The Rural Planning Journal (RPJ) is a multidisciplinary peer-reviewed journal that is published twice a year. Now it welcomes submission of articles for publication in its June 2016, Volume 18 issue no. 1. *The deadline for submission is April 20th 2016.*

Interested Authors are requested to submit their articles as an email article to editorrpj@irdp.ac.tz Instructions for authors are as given here under:

Instructions for Authors

Authors are requested to submit electronic version of their manuscript as email attachment to the Editor-in-Chief, Rural Planning Journal, Institute of Rural Development Planning, through the following e-mail address: editorrpj@irdp.ac.tz

Submission of a paper implies that it has not been published previously, that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere, and that if accepted it will not be published elsewhere in the same form without the written consent of the publisher.

The Editor-in-Chief will forward the manuscript to two reviewers for comments. The author must take into account any revision suggested by the reviewers and the editorial board.

Structure of Articles

- i. The purpose and scope of the article should be clearly stated. Contributors should therefore, show how the article develops and links up with the previous work on the subject.
- ii. Articles should be clearly and concisely written and should not exceed 4000 (four thousand) words.

Manuscript preparation

1. Manuscripts in general should be organized in the following order:

- i. Title, Name(s) of author(s), Affiliations(s), Address(s) and complete correspondence address to which the proofs should be sent, including e-mail address
- ii. Abstract (preferably not more than 200 words. Must be comprehensive and should outline the purpose and methods of the work, and important findings and conclusions)
- iii. Text paper – (a) Introduction; (b) Material studied, Area descriptions, methods and techniques; (c) Results and Discussion; (d) Conclusions/Recommendations figures/table
- iv. References (in the text) should be quoted by the author's name and the date in parentheses. Where there are more than three authors, the first name followed by *et al.*, should be used.

The list of references at the end of the text should be given in alphabetical order, surname of authors, initials, year of publication, title of paper, name of journal in full (in italics); volume and page numbers in which the article is found.

2. The Institute of Rural Development Planning reserves the privilege of returning to the author for revision accepted manuscripts and illustrations that are not in the form given in this guide.

Important to note:

Authors are informed that RPJ is undergoing changes, which will definitely affect the way our articles will appear in Volume 18. Therefore, during the review process our reviewers/editors may give additional instructions to author(s).
